Seventh Annual National Student Paper Competition

I am pleased to inform you that the Seventh Annual National Student Paper Competition, organized by the Canada School of Public Service was launched on November 18th.

We are very pleased to announce that this year, due to the excellent submissions received during our last competition, the President of the Canada School of Public Service, his Deputy Minister colleagues, and the executives responsible for Federal Government – University relationships have promoted the competition and informed the university deans with whom they have relationships of this year's launch. In addition to their efforts, we would be grateful for your assistance in promoting the Competition on your campus, to ensure the broadest coverage as possible.

This competition, open to Masters and Ph.D. students in any faculty, offers a great opportunity for students to share their views on key policy questions, develop new ideas to improve the federal public service and allow these students to positively influence Canada's future. The winner of the competition gains the opportunity to join the Public Service under a four month contract, and the finalists get the opportunity to present their paper to a panel of Deputy Ministers. The Competition allows universities to share the successes of any student who advances to the finals to promote their programs and the university as a whole.

To ensure your students can participate, we ask that interested departments at your university register a professor to act as a departmental coordinator and reviewer. Please note that the 1,500-word submission can be built into the students' course requirements.
